

Election Judges

1. Election judges MUST be a registered voter in Converse County!
2. Election judges CANNOT be a candidate for any office for the current election.
3. Election judges must be able to read, write and speak the English language.
4. Elections require more than 100 election judges.
5. We need election judges, registration judges, canvassing judges, counting board judges, and alternate judges.
6. There is a space on the voter application for you to indicate your interest in being an election judge.
7. Cell phones make it hard to contact you, so please list a land line if you have one.
8. We currently have a great list of election judges that we fully utilize; unfortunately there is always a need for more.
9. Students as young as sixteen can be election judges as well. Students are required to attend training and are paid the same pay as other judges, even though they can't vote until they are 18 year of age.
10. Election judges are on public display and must conduct themselves in an appropriate manner.
11. Election judges are responsible for keeping order at the polling place, maintaining a campaign-free zone, and running a fair and impartial election. Judges may NOT leave the polls from 6:00 a.m. to at least 8:00 p.m.
12. Because rural election judges must bring their own food for Election Day, the County gives them a meal allowance. Election judges serving in the city will have their meals delivered to them.
13. We encourage our judges to have fun, enjoy visiting with your neighbor from across town, as long as you are NOT talking about politics.
